My brothers and sisters, come, join hands with me as we hit the ground running to deliver the Kogi of our dreams.



#### CONSOLIDATION AND CONTINUITY:

THE QUIET REINVENTION
OF KOGI STATE UNDER THE
UNASSUMING ACHIEVER,
GOVERNOR AHMED USMAN
ODODO

In an era of increasing disillusionment with leadership characterised by visible fatigue on the face of citizens with unkept promises, the Kogi State under Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, FCA, is quietly, almost counterintuitively, crafting a counter-narrative. It is the story of a subnational government that is not waiting for the federation to do any of its work - from security to social welfare - but is instead working itself into functionality, dignity and relevance.

At the heart of this remarkable reinvention stands a man who intentionally subsumes his rightful stature as a Governor beneath the service credo of a Chief Servant. Ahmed Usman Ododo leads by a simple but powerful philosophy - S.U.P.E.R Governance which is way more than an acronym. It is an ideological compass with which he centres his administration's focus on what matters most to his people.

There is no doubt that Security, Unity, Prosperity, Equity and Reconciliation (S.U.P.E.R) represents the heartcry of every citizen in today's Nigeria. Ododo and his administration have heard that cry and have adopted this formula as their action points. It is a formula as moral as it is strategic and as practical as it is aspirational. Let us break it down.

#### Security: The Non-Negotiable Need

Like President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, GCFR at the federal level, Governor Ododo inherited a complex security terrain. Before his esteemed predecessor, former Governor Yahaya Bello, came to office in 2016 it was shaped by years of bandit incursions, kidnapping, terrorism, communal conflicts and porous borders. After the Bello years, it was a territory fiercely reclaimed from criminal elements battling relentlessly to return. Upon Governor Ododo fell the life and death duty of keeping them out.

One year after he assumed office, Kogi remains a beacon of relative peace and stability in the embattled middle belt of Nigeria. Under his stewardship strategic investments in surveillance, community policing and security infrastructure continue apace. Ododo is not just reducing crime but also restoring investor confidence. The recent unveiling of state-of-the-art mining equipment and acquisition of 15 mining licenses is not only an economic feat - it is a declaration that peace is being institutionalised by tackling systemic causes such as illegal mining in a way humane manner that still leaves artisanal miners with an option to still ply their trade within a legal framework

#### **Unity: Cultivating A Rare Commodity**

Nigeria's Achilles' heel is often its inability to weld its ethnic and regional components into a shared national purpose. Kogi, in its middlebelt reality, is a microcosm of Nigeria's diversity - and its tensions. Governor Ododo has been intentional about unity from inception. As Governor, he is deliberately pursuing it through sundry peacemaking initiatives like inclusive governance, intercommunal dialogue, Interfaith relations, balanced appointments and shared development. No wonder his state is proving that diversity, when anchored in equity and justice, can be a multiplier force for much good.

#### Prosperity: Beyond Dependency on Federal Allocations

Kogi is no longer content to be a monthly recipient of federal allocations. It is building wealth - strategically. From agricultural revitalisation inspired by best practices from across the world to unlocking its vast mineral wealth through Government equity and public-private partnerships, Kogi is positioning itself as Nigeria's next engine of subnational growth. The resuscitation of technical education and entrepreneurship training across its specialised schools underpins a bold new goal - not just job creation, but entrepreneurship and employment creation.

#### Equity: The Way of Empathetic Governance: blessed with the high aptitude.

Empathy is now a policy tool in Kogi State under a Governor blessed the high aptitude to understand and share the feelings of another. Whether it is attention to Persons Living With

Special Needs (PLSNs), the elevation of women into strategic leadership roles, or educational and vocational scholarship schemes for youth, equity is not merely being preached - it is being practiced. Every budget line, policy document and implementation plan is being interrogated for how it expands fairness.

#### Reconciliation: Healing Through Inclusion

In a political climate where historical and recent grievances tend to fester into violent conflict, the Ododo administration is sowing reconciliation. Traditional institutions are being re-empowered as agents of peace. Post-election fractures are being repaired with civility, not conquest. And within government itself, a new decorum of collaboration is emerging across party lines and institutional hierarchies.

#### Institutional Reform and Financing the New Direction

Behind the scenes, what enables this vision is perhaps even more revolutionary: institutional reforms that prioritise accountability, digitisation, and fiscal prudence. Through reforms in tax administration and a commitment to open government principles, Kogi is financing its own transformation without mortgaging its future. The creation of a functional budgeting system tied to measurable outputs is changing the DNA of governance.

#### Sectoral Progress: From Vision to Impact

In education, all levels of learning from our three universities to thousands of primary schools continue to enjoy close attention to curricular and extracurricular facilities. In healthcare, key tertiary, secondary and primary health centres are being simultaneously revitalised and equipped - while the Kogi State Health Insurance Scheme and other interventions provide citizens with free, affordable and quality medical attention.

In agriculture, mechanisation clusters and access to finance for farmers is ongoing. Aggressive cultivation of nearly 10,000 hectares of staple crops by Government yielded results, with Kogi dropping from the most food-inflated state in Nigeria to the least within Q2 and Q4, 2024. This is true progress with an eye in alleviating the suffering of the masses.

Infrastructure and utilities - roads, bridges, water schemes and energy (regular and alternative) - are sprouting across the three senatorial districts, vastly extending the efforts of the Bello years. Ododo's youth and women empowerment programmes have expanded access and inclusivity for those demographics, with special care to inclusion of persons living with special needs.

Perhaps the most underreported shift, however, is the climate-conscious orientation of the administration. Environmental policies are no longer an afterthought. From green farming techniques to clean energy adoption, the administration is quietly sowing seeds for a resilient future. Ododo's Kogi has cued heavily into ACReSAL - a World Bank project tackling pressing issues of land degradation and climate change in the 19 states of Northern Nigeria - by making counterpart funding obligations a prompt priority and executing projects to the highest standards.

#### All that OAU Needs Now is Your Patience and Participation

Rome was not built in a day. Governor Ododo's governance model is not built on noise. It does not seek applause before results. Instead, it insists on process, discipline, and systembuilding. It is an administration designed not merely to survive electoral cycles, but to birth a culture. This culture demands patience from citizens, yes, but also participation. For no reform can succeed in a society where stock cynicism poisons the sweet waters and sours social support systems.

#### A Governance Template for the Future Nigeria

If Nigeria must be rebuilt, it will be rebuilt from below - by subnationals who refuse to inherit dysfunction as destiny. Kogi State, under His Excellency, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, FCA and the Advanced New Direction Administration, is fast becoming an outlier among those subnationals. It is not perfect. It is still work in progress aplenty, but it is intentional. And in a country where sincerity of purpose is often mistaken for weakness, Governor Ododo's chief servanthood is steadily redefining leadership itself. That, perhaps, is the most radical development of all.

# Introduction Advanced New Direction Administration

hmed Usman Ododo was inaugurated as the 5th Executive Governor of Kogi State on 27th January 2024. His swearingin ushered in a new government christened the Advanced New Direction Administration built on a promise of consolidation and continuity of the foundations laid by the previous government, with a leadership thrust centred on full accountability and

transparency to drive better development outcomes for Kogi State. It will be recalled that the primary election of the All Progressives Congress (APC) on the 15th of April, 2024 produced Alhaji Ahmed Usman Ododo as the Party flagbearer and the successor to the outgoing governor, His Excellency Alhaji Yahaya Bello.

Subsequently, on the 19th of November, 2024 having emerged the winner of Kogi

#### MAO:

Any last words to the people of Kogi State?

#### **GOVERNOR ODODO:**

I urge all Kogites to join hands with me. Let's deliver the Kogi of our dreams – a united, secure, prosperous and progressive state. Let it be said by our children that we chose unity over disunity and worked together to build a better future. God has blessed Kogi State, insha Allah, under my leadership, Kogites will take full advantage of their blessings.

#### MAO:

Thank you very much, Your Excellency. We are rooting for you and we wish you a successful tenure.

overnor Ododo's emergence was not without the peculiar challenges of electioneering in Nigeria. ## 1. On Commitment to Free Basic Education:

Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's administration approved the payment of the 2024/2025 WAEC fees for 18,734 Students in Public Secondary Schools in the State. This payment is in line with the policy of free examination fee for pupils in public schools' enacted by the State Government. The policy stipulates that fees for some internal and externa internal and external examination for pupils in public primary schools are the responsibility of the government underscoring Governor Ododo's dedication to equitable access to education for all Kogi children. This initiative reflects a commitment to ensuring that financial barriers do not hinder any child's right to quality education and thus make life easier for their parents and guardians.

#### 2. Support for Higher Education:

Recognizing the financial challenges faced





by students in tertiary institutions, the administration approved a bursary fund of N315 million for 8,750 Kogi indigenes. This move alleviates the economic burdens on families, fostering a culture of higher education and skill development among the youth and underlines the State Government commitment to making sure that all the students of the State in Higher Institutions across the country feel the impact of the Government. The administration also re-enacted a policy for the Establishment of the Kogi State Scholarship Board which is saddled with the responsibility of overseeing the disbursement of these bursary awards to the citizens.

## 3. Infrastructure Development at Kogi State University, Kabba:

In line with his policy on investments in educational infrastructure, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo approved a monumental N8 billion investment for the construction of critical infrastructure at the Kogi State University (KSU), Kabba. This includes a Senate building, a Faculty of Science, and modern male and female hostels. The University has also seen the construction of internal roads, university library and gates at an advanced stage by the administration. These facilities are pivotal in elevating the university to a hub of academic excellence and attracting toptier talent to the institution.

## 4. Skills Acquisition and Vocational Training:

In partnership with the Nigeria-Korea Friendship Institute in Lokoja, the administration enrolled 250 youths in skills acquisition programs. Documentation has since begun and the institute will equip them with technical expertise and enhance their employability. This initiative bridges the gap between education and workforce readiness, contributing to Kogi's human capital development.

#### 5. Promotion of Renewable Energy Education:

The launch of the Barefoot Renewable Energy Academy at the Confluence University of Science and Technology (CUSTECH), Osara, is a bold step toward integrating sustainable development into education. This academy positions Kogi State as a leader in renewable energy innovation, preparing students to tackle future energy challenges while driving environmental sustainability.

#### 6. Advancing Education in the State

Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo in a bid to advance education and healthcare in Kogi state signed a bill converting the state-of-the-art Reference Hospital, Okene into the Confluence University of Science and Technology (CUSTECH) Teaching Hospital. The move aligns with the National Universities Commission's

approval of a full-time Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) program, among other medical courses, at the university. This move is regarded as a solid foundation on which the program begins. With this development, CUSTECH will have cutting-edge medical technology to train outstanding healthcare professionals for Kogi State and beyond, while the facility could also take care of complex health challenges. With the bill now passed into law, CUSTECH is poised to effectively commence its MBBS program.

7. These achievements signal a new era of progress and inclusivity in Kogi State's education sector. By prioritizing free education, enhancing education infrastructure, and promoting technical and vocational skills, Governor Ododo's administration is fostering a generation of empowered, skilled, and self-reliant individuals. These policies are not just investments in education but in the socio-economic future of Kogi State, ensuring that its citizens are prepared to contribute meaningfully to state and

national development. Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's education reforms, in their scope and ambition, are a testament to his administration's vision of a prosperous, knowledge-driven Kogi State.

8. In a bid to further explore opportunities in education, Kogi State participated in the National Reading Framework Dissemination for Improved Literacy Across Nigeria




































# Chapter 3:

The year has witnessed significant advancements in the health

Sector under the Advanced New Direction Administration.

1. The Administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo approved a 50% subsidy on health insurance premium deductions for Civil servants in the State in the next one year. Despite the consistent 5% Employer Contribution of State Government to the Formal Sector Health Insurance Plan for Civil Servants in the State which has been implemented in the State to provide financial risk protection to civil servants and their dependents.

Furthermore, as contained in the MoU signed between the State Government and the Organized Labour in the State, His Excellency, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo directed the Health Insurance Agency to continue the 1.75% Employee Premium deduction instead of 3.5% for the next one year in addition to the tax waiver earlier given on the new minimum wage addition to ensure the civil servants enjoy their new minimum wage and the prescribed health insurance plan. This is as against the 3.5% increase employee contribution expected when the State Government commences the implementation of the new minimum wage

This is to allow civil servants remain committed in the discharge of their duty due to the enabling environment provided to them while the state ministry of health continues to improve on provision of quality healthcare service delivery to the people.

- 2. His Excellency Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo in the last one year also ensured all necessary support were placed on the table to take quality, accessible, available and affordable healthcare to the people of the state. This is reflected in the approval of Revitalization of 194 PHCs across the state by the Kogi State Government in collaboration with the Federal Government (NPHCDA/ BHCPF), World Bank (IMPACT), UNICEF amongst others
- 3. In a collective effort to combat tuberculosis in Kogi State and her commitment

- to healthcare excellence, Her Excellency the first lady of Kogi State, Hajia Sefinat Usman Ododo launched the STOP TB campaign in Kogi state. This is a campaign aimed at ending TB by 2030. In the same vein, His Excellency the chief servant of Kogi state Alh. Ahmed Usman Ododo humbly flagged off the distribution of 2 Toyota hilux vans and 42 motorcycles to the 21 LGAs for the Monitoring and Supervision of Tuberculosis and Leprosy
- The State Ministry of Health in conjunction with the Nigeria Health Sector Renewal Investment Initiative (NHSRII) has successfully developed the Health Sector Strategic Blueprint (HSSB) for 2023-2027, which has since been endorsed by the National Council on Health (NCH) and has also gotten the approval of the president for a Sector-Wide Approach (SWAP) as the guiding framework for health initiatives and outcomes.

This approach aims to scale up health outcomes through the unified efforts of the President, the 36 State Governors, and Donor Partners, in reforming the health sector. SWAp now serves as a vital tool for delivering the HSSB and NHSRII and it is aimed to achieve the following in the State:

- » Empowerment of State-Level Health Systems
- » Universal Health Coverage

With the tireless effort of the Governor to achieve an improved number of qualified health worker forces in other to address the gap in human resource for health, the State Ministry of Health has catapulted the efforts of the management, staff and students at the College of Health Sciences and Technology, Idah to recently amongst other new programs secured the approval/ accreditation of the National Board for Technical Education
- a. HND Environmental Health Technology.
- b. HND Health Information Management.

These two recent accreditations put the institution as the third health sciences and technology college to achieve such in North central Nigeria.

This is an initiative introduced to achieve Universal Health Coverage in the State which allows residents of Kogi State to have access to quality and good health care services without suffering financial

hardship while going for those services.
 This move is to ensure that the people of Kogi State have access to good health service and live a quality life.

The administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has immunized about 77, 495 children in rural communities across seven Local Government Areas of the state.

The was made known by the State Immunization Officer, Dr. Grace Ojofedo following the successful completion of the "Big -Catch -UP" Polio Immunization program in the state. This development will help to consolidate on the 10-year-old polio-free status of the State.

The exercise were carried out in communities that were not earlier properly captured in the last year immunization program. Implemented in 7 LGAs in the state, a total of 80608 vaccines were used and a total number of 77495 children were immunized."

This exercise recorded 99% coverage rate but also suffered 5 percent wastage rate in the latest program carried out between January 6 – January 13, 2025.

UNICEF was applauded for its contribution to the program, the agency's supports is helping the state maintain the zero polio status, stressing that the state will not spare any efforts to consolidate on its Polio-free status.

From the groundbreaking Special **Agro-Industrial Processing Zone** in Ajaokuta to debt reduction and fostering public-private partnerships, the state is becoming a hub for innovation, agriculture, and commerce. # Policy Brief

Budget of Consolidation and Continuity for Inclusive Growth

The Kogi State 2024 budget, approved at N258,278,501,339.00, represents a 30.71% increase over the 2023 revised budget. It includes a significant allocation for capital expenditure (N112.5 billion) and recurrent expenditure (N145.7 billion). The budget prioritizes good governance, infrastructure development, education, healthcare, agriculture, security, and women's empowerment. Kogi State's 2023 and 2024 budgets reveals a strategic intensification of public investment across all sectors, with particularly notable increases in the economic sector (from \(\frac{1}{2}\)68.65bn to \(\frac{1}{2}\)80.5bn) and social services (from \(\frac{1}{2}\)49.36bnto \(\frac{1}{2}\)55.2bn), reflecting the administration's commitment to infrastructure, education, health, and economic diversification. The significant jump in allocations to law and justice (from \(\frac{1}{2}\)5.99bn to \(\frac{1}{2}\)10.1bn) also signals a renewed focus on institutional reform, security and justice delivery. Overall, the shift tells a story of forward-looking governance aimed at consolidating gains, deepening impact, and significantly accelerating the momentum of development across the Confluence State.














# Chapter 5:

# Kogi State Ministry of Rural and Energy Development

# DRIVING TRANSFORMATION THROUGH INFRASTRUCTURE AND ACCESS

The Kogi State Ministry of Rural and Energy Development is a strategic organ of the State Government tasked with the critical responsibility of driving rural transformation. The Ministry focuses on providing essential amenities to rural communities, including the provision of electricity, potable water, access roads to farmlands, and the enhancement of other social infrastructure necessary to improve the quality of life in underserved areas.

At the helm of the Ministry is Engr. Mohammed Abdulmutalib, a distinguished electrical engineer and former senior officer at the Power Holding Company of Nigeria (PHCN). Under his leadership, the Ministry has witnessed significant reforms and recorded remarkable achievements in advancing rural development in Kogi State.

#### • RAAMP AND THE AGRICULTURAL IMPERATIVE

One of the Ministry's flagship initiatives is the construction of rural access roads under the Rural Access and Agricultural Marketing Project (RAAMP), a collaborative programme between the Kogi State Government and the World Bank. The focus of RAAMP is to open up the rural economy by providing farmers with access to all-season roads that link them to urban markets and agro-processing zones.

Agriculture remains the bedrock of Nigeria's economy, and the rural regions are the heart of this sector. Yet, for years, rural communities have grappled with the absence of good roads, leading to high post-harvest losses, limited market access, and suppressed rural incomes. These infrastructural challenges have also stifled the availability of modern amenities such as telecommunications and internet services, essential for driving digital inclusion and economic diversification.

#### THE NEW DIRECTION LEGACY AND ODODO'S CONTINUITY

In 2016, under the leadership of former Governor Yahaya Bello, a community-based approach to development was adopted. The Bello administration conducted extensive consultations with local communities to identify their most pressing needs, which laid the groundwork for the state's "New Direction Blueprint." This strategic plan prioritized rural infrastructure, including healthcare facilities, potable water, and quality roads. The result was a visible improvement in the welfare of rural communities across Kogi State.

Building upon this legacy, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has shown commendable political will and continuity by prioritizing rural infrastructure as a critical aspect of his administration's development agenda. Since assuming office, he has directed significant attention toward the rehabilitation and construction of rural roads across the 21 local government areas of the state, with particular focus on communities in Kabba, Yagba West, Yagba East, Lokoja, and Omala, among others.

To reinforce the government's resolve, Governor Ododo has ensured full commitment to the state's counterpart funding requirement under the RAAMP initiative. This investment is not only a testament to the Governor's dedication to rural development but also a catalyst for unlocking the state's agricultural and economic potential.

#### • RURAL MARKET UPGRADES: STIMULATING TRADE AT THE GRASSROOTS

Recognizing that rural roads alone are not enough to transform agricultural productivity, the Ododo administration has also embarked on an ambitious plan to revamp key rural markets across the state. Under Kogi RAAMP, three major markets—Ajaka Market in Kogi East, Aku Market in Kogi Central, and Aiyegunle Market in Kogi West—have been identified for comprehensive redevelopment.

Each of these markets is earmarked to receive investments of not less than #1 billion. This intervention will include the construction of modern stalls, storage facilities, parking lots, water supply systems, and waste disposal mechanisms. These upgrades are designed to promote agribusiness, reduce post-harvest losses, and improve the hygiene and efficiency of trade activities in rural markets.

#### **KEY ROAD PROJECTS UNDER IMPLEMENTATION**

As part of the first phase of implementation under the Ministry of Rural and Energy Development, several rural road projects have been approved and are currently ongoing. These roads are intended to bridge the infrastructure gap and boost agricultural logistics. Some of the major projects include:

In order to ensure that farmers do not only have access to their farms, the government also embark on the construction of rural markets for sales of their commodities. These include:

- Construction of Ajaka Abocho Road (Kogi East)
- Rehabilitation of Egbe Odo Ere Ponyan Road (Kogi West)
- Reconstruction of Zango Apata Okene Road (Kogi Central)
- Rehabilitation of Omala Abejukolo Ogodu Road

Construction of feeder roads linking rural farm clusters to market centres in Dekina and Ankpa LGAs

These projects are carefully selected based on the volume of agricultural activities, population density, and the socio-economic potential of the areas they serve. Once completed, they are expected to open up new economic corridors and stimulate growth across various sectors of the rural economy.

#### • A FUTURE ANCHORED IN INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT

The efforts of the Kogi State Ministry of Rural and Energy Development under Engr. Abdulmutalib's leadership, with the full support of Governor Ododo, represent a clear shift toward inclusive development. The focus on rural areas reflects a genuine understanding that for Nigeria to grow equitably, the grassroots must not be left behind.

From market modernization and road construction to community-driven planning and strategic partnerships, Kogi State is setting a commendable pace in rural development. With agriculture at the core of its economic agenda, and the empowerment of rural communities as a strategic goal, the state is poised to become a model for others in driving sustainable and inclusive growth.

#### RURAL ELECTRIFICATION: POWERING RURAL TRANSFORMATION IN KOGI STATE

One of the most vital catalysts for rural transformation is the presence of reliable electricity. Access to power changes the socio-economic dynamics of rural communities—it fosters productivity, enhances security, promotes health and education, and improves the overall quality of life. In recognition of this fact, the Kogi State Ministry of Rural and Energy Development has been unwavering in its commitment to extending power supply to even the remotest parts of the state. Under the leadership of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, the Ministry is leading a comprehensive effort to eliminate energy poverty and ensure every community parts ways with darkness.

The Ministry, under the supervision of seasoned technocrats and engineers, has rolled out several rural electrification projects that are directly impacting lives and businesses. One of the major highlights of these interventions is the successful installation of vital power infrastructure in multiple communities. Notably, the Ministry procured and installed a 500kVA, 33/0.415kV transformer, complete with 30 spans of high-tension lines, two uprisers, and low-tension reticulation at Oziokutu community. Similarly, a 500kVA, 33/0.415kV transformer with 11 spans of HT lines and associated LT infrastructure was installed at Iruvucheba along Old Lagos Road in Okene, Okene Local Government Area.

To address power challenges in the state capital and enhance energy availability for critical government institutions, the Ododoled administration extended the 33kV CBN feeder line across Lokoja metropolis. As part of this effort, the Ministry installed a series of transformers including one 500kVA, one 300kVA, two 200kVA, and two 100kVA units—all operating at 33/0.415kV. Additionally, a new 33kV line was extended to power communities around the State Assembly complex, alongside the installation of a hybrid transformer at the Kogi State Broadcasting Corporation (Radio Kogi), comprising a 200kVA/33/0.415kVA transformer backed by a 15kVA solar-inverter system.

In Kogi West Senatorial District, a strategic intervention to boost electricity reliability was initiated through the complete rehabilitation and procurement of a 33kV line spanning 375 meters. This also included the replacement of faulty components, relocation of bush paths, thorough line tracing, and vegetation control—ensuring better electricity transmission and reduced system losses across the region.

#### A BOLD VISION: ESTABLISHMENT OF THE KOGI STATE ELECTRICITY REGULATORY COMMISSION (KSERC)

Perhaps the most ambitious and forward-thinking initiative in the power sector by Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's administration is the creation of the Kogi State Electricity Regulatory Commission (KSERC). This bold step was in response to the decentralization of the electricity sector in Nigeria, which allows State Governments to take charge of electricity generation, distribution, and regulation within their territories. In August 2024, the Kogi State Government formally notified the Nigerian Electricity Regulatory Commission (NERC) of its intention to commence the transfer of regulatory responsibilities to the state level.

Recognizing the state's preparedness and political will, the NERC, on September 12th, 2024, issued a formal order enabling the transition to a state-managed electricity market.

To operationalize this historic development, the State Government appointed the Chairman of the KSERC on October 30th, 2024. Subsequently, on December 23rd, 2024, Commissioners and a Secretary were appointed to steer the affairs of the new commission. By February 4th, 2025, key staff were also engaged using a lean and efficient organogram structure to begin the Commission's daily operations.

The Commission has since hit the ground running. On February 20th, the KSERC team embarked on a benchmarking visit to the Enugu Electricity Distribution Commission to study best practices in regulatory operations. Following this, on March 4th, 2025, the Commission met with the management of Abuja Electricity Distribution Company (AEDC), led by Barrister Ibuwo Ukwu. The meeting was aimed at introducing the Acting MD/CEO of the newly formed Kogi Electricity Distribution Limited (KEDL), exploring areas of cooperation, and strengthening Kogi State's emerging electricity market.

#### TOWARDS AN INDEPENDENT ELECTRICITY MARKET IN KOGI STATE

In preparation for full market operations, the Commission held a major stakeholder engagement session on March 10th, 2025. This forum brought together key players in the power sector, community representatives, and regulatory experts to discuss expectations and roles in the evolving electricity landscape of Kogi State. A defining moment came on March 12th, 2025, when the Kogi State Electricity Market was officially handed over to the KSERC. A six-month interim license (from March 12th to September 12th, 2025) was issued to KEDL, which will act as the sub-national distribution company, pending full regulatory approval and operational consolidation. To ensure the effective enforcement of electricity laws, a high-level meeting was held between KSERC and the Attorney General and Commissioner for Justice, Kogi State. A key resolution from this meeting was the urgent need to criminalize energy theft and vandalism—through the establishment of a mobile court system that will fast-track the prosecution of offenders and deter future sabotage.

In conclusion, Kogi State's efforts in rural electrification are not just about lighting up communities—they are about powering prosperity, driving development, and fostering equity. From physical infrastructure development to strategic institutional reforms, the administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo is laying the groundwork for a more inclusive, functional, and self-sustaining energy sector.

With the Ministry of Rural and Energy Development leading transformative on-ground projects, and the KSERC shaping a structured regulatory environment, Kogi State is setting a pace for others to follow in sub-national energy governance. The journey to universal electricity access may be long, but the roadmap is clear—and the future is bright.



- » Major road reconstructions in Mopa, Egbe, Yagba West, and Ijumu.
- » Strategic rural road initiatives such as:
- » 19.55-kilometer Obajana-Uro-Aku Road (RAAMP).
- » 16-kilometer Oguma-Seriya Road.
- » 9-kilometer Zone 8 Roundabout-GYB Junction Dual Carriageway.

- » 6-kilometer Zone 8 Roundabout-Crusher Dual Carriageway.
- » 8.8-kilometer Ogaminana Obangede-Okaito Road.
- » Also, the administration has commenced the upgrade of the Adogo Airstrip into an international cargo airport, which is poised to facilitate trade, job creation, and logistical advancements across Kogi State.

#### **Urban Renewal Projects Across State Cities**

Governor Ododo has championed urban renewal initiatives, aimed at transforming the state's cities into hubs of economic activity and modernity. These projects include the installation of solar-powered streetlights in major cities, which have improved urban aesthetics and enhanced public safety. - » Restoration of water supply schemes and provision of boreholes and hand-pump facilities for rural communities, ensuring access to safe drinking water.


These initiatives are pivotal in improving public health and fostering environmental sustainability across the state.


#### **Energy Development**


- The completion of a 33KV power transmission line and the upgrade of electricity distribution infrastructure.






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

### Chapter 8:

# Agriculture and Rural Development

Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's administration has, within its first year, demonstrated an unwavering commitment to agriculture and rural development in Kogi State.



hrough innovative policies, strategic investments, and a deep understanding of the challenges faced by the rural population, the administration has laid the groundwork for sustainable economic growth and development. These achievements are evident in transformative initiatives that have boosted food security, improved farmer productivity, and enhanced rural infrastructure. The emphasis on integrating agricultural reforms with rural development strategies has not only revitalized the state's economy but also significantly uplifted the standard of living for its people.

Agriculture has always been a central pillar of Kogi State's economy, employing a significant portion of the population. However, the sector has historically faced challenges such as low productivity, inadequate infrastructure, limited mechanization, and poor access to markets. Governor Ododo's administration has tackled these issues head-on with comprehensive interventions that have energized the sector. One of the administration's flagship programs is the 2024 Wet Season Farming Initiative. Recognizing the need for increased agricultural output and food security, the government invested over N7 billion in this initiative. This program provided critical inputs such as over 100 tractors, fertilizers, herbicides, and improved seedlings to nearly 10,000 farmers. The beneficiaries, organized into 76 clusters across the state, collectively cultivated 7,324 hectares of farmland. The major crops targeted under this program included rice, maize, and cassava, which are staple foods and key economic crops in Kogi State.

This initiative has been transformative. It has not only increased agricultural productivity but has also created opportunities for rural households to improve their livelihoods. The focus on cluster farming

has encouraged collaboration among farmers, enabling them to share resources and best practices. By making improved seedlings available, the administration has also enhanced the quality and yield of crops, ensuring that farmers can compete favorably in both local and national markets. Mechanization has played a vital role in the success of this program. For decades, farming in Kogi State has been characterized by traditional methods, which are labor-intensive and yield low outputs. The administration's provision of modern farming equipment, such as tractors, has revolutionized the way farming is conducted. Farmers can now cultivate larger areas of land more efficiently, reducing the physical strain associated with manual labor. Mechanization has not only improved productivity but has also attracted younger individuals to farming, addressing the aging population of farmers in the state.

Beyond providing inputs and mechanized tools, the administration has prioritized the need for farmers to have access to lucrative markets.

Many farmers in Kogi State have previously faced difficulties in selling their produce, often due to inadequate transportation infrastructure,

poor storage facilities, and exploitative market practices. Governor Ododo's administration has taken deliberate steps to address these challenges by strengthening agricultural value chains. Value chain improvement involves enhancing every stage of agricultural production, from planting to harvesting, processing, and marketing. The government has invested in better storage facilities to reduce post-harvest losses, ensuring that farmers can preserve their produce for longer periods without fear of spoilage. Additionally, efforts have been made to establish linkages between farmers and buyers, eliminating middlemen who often take a significant share of the profits. These measures have increased farmers' incomes and make agriculture a more viable and attractive livelihood option. Logistics infrastructure has also received attention. With improved roads and transport networks, farmers now have better access to urban markets where demand and prices are higher. This improvement in market access has created a ripple effect, boosted rural economies and encouraged more investments in agriculture.

To boost the State's agricultural development, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo of Kogi State inaugurated a Steering and Technical Committee to oversee the Livestock Productivity and Resilience Support (L-PRES) Project. This initiative aims to enhance productivity, resilience and improve commercialization in livestock farming. This program focuses on three value chains: Sheep and Goat, Cattle, and Poultry farming, which will significantly boost the fortunes of livestock farmers in Kogi State.

With an innovative cost-saving mechanism, the administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo saved over 20 billion naira by refurbishing approximately 200 abandoned tractors, restoring them to near-new condition for the 2024 wet season farming. This innovative



cost-saving measure prompted by prevailing economic situation urged him to refurbish the disused tractors, which were initially procured by his predecessor, Alhaji Yahaya Bello, but left abandoned in various farm settlements. This initiative has then helped to save about over 20billion which would have been spent on purchasing new ones along with procurement processes, shipment, and clearing. So far, over 2 billion naira was expended to refurbish 140 tractors.

While agriculture remains a focal point, Governor Ododo understands that its growth is intricately tied to the development of rural infrastructure. Most farmers in Kogi State live has historically hindered their productivity and quality of life. The administration's efforts in rural electrification and road development have been instrumental in addressing these been a top priority. In collaboration with the World Bank and other development partners, the administration flagged off the construction of the 20-kilometer Obajana-Uro-Aku rural road under the Rural Access and Agricultural Marketing Project (RAAMP). This project is a game-changer for farmers and rural communities. By providing better connectivity,

the road reduces transportation costs and time, enabling farmers to transport their produce to markets more efficiently. Improved roads also attract other forms of economic activity, such as small businesses, thereby fostering rural economic growth.

Rural electrification has been another area of focus. Many rural communities in Kogi State have long struggled with a lack of access to reliable electricity, which limits their economic opportunities and quality of life. Governor Ododo's administration has initiated projects to extend electricity to these underserved areas. Reliable power is essential for the agricultural sector, as it enables the use of irrigation systems, processing equipment, and cold storage facilities. It also creates opportunities for small-scale businesses such as milling and packaging enterprises, which add value to agricultural produce and generate additional income for rural families.

One of the hallmarks of Governor Ododo's administration is its integrated approach to development. The government recognizes that agriculture, rural infrastructure, and economic growth are interdependent. As such, its policies and programs are designed to address these sectors holistically. For

example, the administration's efforts to boost agricultural productivity are closely linked to its investments in rural roads and better roads and reliable electricity are more likely to adopt modern farming techniques and invest in value-added processing. Similarly, the government's focus on market access is supported by its improvements in logistics and storage facilities. This integration are amplified, creating a sustainable cycle of growth and development. Governor strong emphasis on community involvement. By engaging with local leaders, farmer government has ensured that its policies are tailored to the specific needs and aspirations of the people. This participatory approach has not only enhanced the effectiveness of the government's programs but has also fostered among the beneficiaries.

The combined effects of these initiatives have been profound. Thousands of farmers have benefited from the government's interventions, with many reporting significant increases infrastructure has reduced the drudgery of farming and made it a more attractive profession, particularly for young people. Rural communities have also experienced a noticeable improvement in their living standards. Better roads and electrification have not only enhanced economic opportunities but have also improved access to essential services such as education and healthcare. By addressing the root causes of rural poverty, Governor Ododo's administration is laying the foundation for long-term prosperity and resilience. As one of the major thematic areas of the Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's administration, his indelible mark has also been made in the following areas in the sector.

Key Highlights of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo in Kogi State Agricultural Intervention 2024 Wet Season

- 1. Kogi State Government supported 7,324 direct beneficiaries and 36,620 indirect beneficiary farmers for the 2024 wet season cropping
- 2. 5,124 direct beneficiary farmers were supported for rice production

- 3. 1,200 direct beneficiary farmers were supported for cassava production
- 4. 1,000 beneficiary farmers were supported for maize production
- 5. Each farmer was supported to produce 1 hectare of the identified crop based onagro-ecology and comparative advantage for production.
- 6. 6. Agro-inputs namely improved seeds, fertilizers and herbicides were provided for farmers free of charge.
- 7. Tractorization of farms was done for farmers free of charge including transport to and from farm clusters, fueling, repairs and maintenance.
- 8. The ministry supplied 15,372 bags of improved rice seeds;15,000 bags of granulated NPK 20:10:10; 50,000 sachets of soluble NPK and Urea fertilizers; 6,418 bags of granulated Urea; 72,000 bundles of cassava stems and 43,944 litres of assorted herbicides to produce rice, cassava and maize.
- 9. The Ministry collaborated with the Kogi State Chapter of All Farmers Association of Nigeria and its commodity officials for rice, cassava and maize on planning and implementation of the special intervention which was very successful.
- 10. Training of 50 youth farmers on climatesmart agriculture on various enterprises is on-going in Abeokuta, Ogun State. Through the Livestock Productivity and Resilience
- 11. 15 No solar powered borehole was drilled and installed to serve agro-pastoralists settlement and livestock markets.
- 12. An E-extension and Advisory service center was established and commissioned at the Kogi ADP headquarters to support their existing extension system.
- 13. 500 women and youth poultry entreprenuers were empowered with production, marketing and processing inputs. This has boosted poultry production in the State.

14. 30 No fodder choppers and 2100kg fodder seeds were distributed to 300 livestock farmers.

### Collaboration with the Federal Government

The Federal government agricultural support to kogi state through collaboration has also delivered massive results. These includes:

- » Federal Ministry of Agriculture provided agro-inputs to poultry, fishery and crops farmers in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning as palliative.
- » Training of agricultural extension workers by the Federal Department of Agricultural Extension
- » Supply of 25 trucks of fertilizers to Kogi State for the 2024 wet season cropping
- » Supply of agro-inputs to about 1,000 farmers for the 2024 dry season cropping activities

At the meeting, the Kogi State Commissioner for Rural and Energy Development highlighted that T he impact of electricity on rural communities cannot be overstated," the commissioner noted. "With enhanced energy access, we can transform livelihoods, stimulate local industries, and foster sustainable growth."

Mr. Abba Aliyu, Managing Director/CEO of the REA, commended Governor Alhaji Ahmed Usman Ododo for prioritizing energy development, emphasizing the agency's dedication to providing renewable energy solutions. He revealed that Kogi State is well-positioned to benefit from ongoing interventions aimed at electrifying rural areas.

Engr. Doris Uboh, Executive Director of the Rural Electrification Fund, also lauded the collaboration. She shared that the fund has already attracted over \$\Pi\$5 billion in private investments, generating over 26,000 jobs across the country

Kogi State's Chief Economic Adviser, Mr. Aliyu Salami, spotlighted the state's renewable energy potential, citing abundant resources such as solar, hydropower, biomass, and wind. # FOOD INFLATION IN KOGI STATE



Kogi's food inflation rate decreased significantly.

From Top to Bottom - Ododo's Common Sense Approach to Beating Food Inflation

Data by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) show that Kogi State experienced what some would call a 'magical shift' in its food inflation rates in 2024. In January 2024, Kogi recorded the highest year-on-year food inflation rate in Nigeria at 44.18%, surpassing all other states. However, by November 2024, Kogi's food inflation rate had decreased to 32.95%, making it the second-lowest in the country, just behind Kwara State at 31.39%. The drastic improvement was thanks to targeted agricultural interventions by the administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo. The government invested over #7 billion, deployed 100+ tractors, directly cultivated over 7,000 hectares of farmland and heavily supported smallholder farmers with inputs and training. In just a matter of months, these efforts improved food production, stabilized market access and curbed inflationary pressure. The turnaround rapidly reversed food inflation and enhanced food security - illustrating how the incumbent in Kogi State deploys strategic policy and pointed investment to solve hard problems cheaply.

# Policy Brief

## Establishment of Kogi State Electricity Regulatory Framework

### Background:

In line with Nigeria's amended Electricity Act 2023 empowering sub-national electricity markets, the Kogi State Government under Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo initiated comprehensive reforms to establish state-led regulation and administration of electricity supply within the state's territory.

### Objectives:

- To create a legal and institutional framework for the Kogi State Electricity Market.
- To transfer regulatory oversight of intrastate electricity generation, transmission, and distribution to the State Government.
- To promote investment in renewable and off-grid electricity solutions.
- To improve efficiency, consumer protection, and service delivery in the electricity sector.

### Key Actions Undertaken (June 2024 - January 27, 2025):

- 1. **Enactment of Enabling Law**In June 2024, His Excellency, Governor
  Ahmed Usman Ododo, assented to a bill establishing:
- The Kogi State Electricity Market, and
- The Kogi State Electricity Regulatory Commission (KSERC).

### The law provides for:

- Licensing of electricity market participants,
- Regulation of tariffs and service quality,
- Development of both grid and off-grid electricity projects within the State.

### 2. Transfer of Regulatory Oversight

In September 2024, the Nigerian
Electricity Regulatory Commission (NERC)
formally transferred regulatory oversight
of Kogi State's intrastate electricity market
to KSERC. This transfer was in compliance
with constitutional provisions and federal
guidelines enabling state-level electricity
regulation.

As part of this process, NERC issued a directive requiring the Abuja Electricity Distribution Company (AEDC) to incorporate a dedicated subsidiary (AEDC SubCo) to serve as the licensed distribution entity within Kogi State.

## 3. Institutional Capacity Building and Stakeholder Consultations

- Throughout the fourth quarter of 2024, KSERC commenced the development of operational regulations, licensing procedures, and tariff methodologies
- Preliminary stakeholder engagements were held with:
- Distribution and generation companies,
- Consumer advocacy groups,
- Prospective investors.

These consultations focused on ensuring transparency, fairness and readiness for the eventual commencement of KSERC's full regulatory functions.

### 4. Expected Outcomes:

- Strengthening of regulatory governance in the electricity sector.
- Attracting of investments into power generation and distribution infrastructure
- Improvement of electricity infrastructure, reliability and affordability.
- Enhanced consumer protections within the State.

### **Conclusion:**

The Government of Kogi State remains resolutely committed to ensuring that the State's electricity sector evolves into one of the most efficient, transparent, and investorfriendly markets in Nigeria and across the globe. As these foundational reforms take root, His Excellency, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, has affirmed that the Administration will continue working throughout 2025 and beyond to strengthen regulatory capacity, expand generation and distribution infrastructure, and secure reliable, affordable power for all citizens and businesses across Kogi State. This determination reflects the vision of positioning Kogi as a model for sub-national electricity market development in Nigeria.



# Chapter 10: Security, Law and Justice Reforms

Security remains a pivotal thematic area under Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's Advanced New Direction Administration.



he previous administration of Kogi State, under the leadership of Governor Yahaya Bello, made remarkable strides in enhancing security across the state. Recognizing the critical importance of security for sustainable development, the administration deployed a robust approach to tackle insecurity, which had plagued the state for years. Through a combination of political will, innovative policies, and collaboration with security agencies, Kogi State witnessed a significant reduction in criminal activities such as armed robbery, kidnapping, and communal clashes.

Some of the key achievements include the establishment of operational bases for security agencies, the deployment of technology to track security threats (KIWI), fostering interagency collaboration and recruiting police constabularies for intelligence gathering.

Notable initiatives like the establishment of the Kogi State Vigilante Service provided localized and grassroots support to law enforcement efforts, leading to improved intelligence gathering and swift response to threats. As a result, Kogi State transitioned from being a

hotbed of insecurity to one of the safest states in Nigeria.

Building on this legacy, the administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has prioritized the consolidation and advancement of these security achievements. Since taking office on January 27, 2024, Governor Ododo has underscored his commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of all citizens as a foundation for economic growth and development. His administration has continued to strengthen partnerships with security agencies and community stakeholders to sustain peace and order across the state. The last one year has witnessed some key achievements by the Advanced New Direction Administration in the Security sector.

As part of strengthening Kogi State's security network, the administration has reinforced grassroots security by recruiting about 1,000 local hunters across the 21 Local Government Area in the State. These individuals, with extensive knowledge of the terrain and communities played a critical role in surveillance and intelligence gathering to

fend off security threats from across the borders of each local Government Area in the State. They administration equipped them with essential gear, including ballistic vests, combat boots, and modern security gadgets. This initiative not only empowers local communities to take an active role in their own security but also serves as a valuable complement to the efforts of conventional security forces.

The actions of the governor to address mobility challenges and enhance operational efficiency has seen the distribution of over 250 operational vehicles and hundreds of motorcycles to both local hunters and Vigilantes. This logistical boost enables swift deployment, even in hard-to-reach areas, reducing delays in tackling incidents. The conventional forces (Army, Navy, Police, Civil Defence) were also equipped with Hilux vans to help in swift response to threats and combat attacks. In the same vein, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo in his commitment to partnering with security agencies to tackle crime donated a vehicle and 5 motorcycles to the Zonal security adviser for Idah

Federal Constituency in other to discharge his duties effectively. This underscores his administration's unwavering stance against criminal elements in all parts of the State.

In a bold move to ensure urban security, the administration established the Metropolitan Quick Response (MQR) a rapid response unit designed to reduce response times to security incidents. This initiative has enhanced public confidence, particularly in the metropolitan areas, where swift intervention is crucial.

The State also embarked on clearance Operations all through the State to detonate and fend off banditries who found their way into the state because of the Military clearance operations in the North-East. The efforts of the Vigilantes and local hunters who were involved in the policing process have helped to clear out these elements. The continuous synergistic arrangements amongst the fighting force (Army, Navy. Police, Civil Defence) have also helped to stabilize security in the State. This was further strengthened as the State distributed Hilux vans for the security apparatus in the state to enhance their operations.

In a bid to nip insecurity in the bud in the State, the administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has commissioned a Forward Operation Base Abejukolo in Omala Local Government Area. This was established to put an end to incessant strike and killings of community members by unknown gunmen in Agojeju-Odo and Bagana which has defied a lasting solution. This highlights the commitment of his administration to addressing the security challenge that has bedeviled that community.

With his resolve of zero tolerance for criminality and determination to restore peace and stability to that region, a Joint Taskforce Patrol Unit was also stationed in Bagana to make sure of a sustained security presence in the area. These facilities served as strategic outposts for security personnels to address the continuous threat and attacks on Omala communities. This has played a significant role in restoring peace in the community, its strategic location has also helped security forces to respond swiftly to emergencies which reduced reaction times and helped minimize the potential for loss of life and property.

Through the existing synergy between the State and the Nigerian Navy, patrol boats and gun boats have been deployed to secure water ways, while the State Government also provided about 20 motorbikes for

ease and access to remote terrains within the community. Houses have also been renovated for Strategic planning on operational deployment to ensure that peace is permanently restored to that area and her economic activities be brought back to live.

This initiative is a significant step by the administration of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo in breaking the cycle of violence and insecurity that has plagued Omala for a long while.

With a deep understanding of the implications of unemployment and the linkage it has with insecurity, the State Government, in a move to curb this menace launched the Ododo Youth Empowerment and Skill Acquisition (OYESA) program. This initiative is in partnership with the Nigeria-Korea Friendship Institute, Lokoja which will equip 250 young individuals from across the state with valuable vocational skills in various programmes offered by the institute. These categories of youth will be empowered with various skills that will enhance their capacity to be self-employed to contribute positively to society. Its multiplier effect is to discourage youths from picking up social vices or being used as instrument for causing insecurity in the State.

Governor Ododo's approach reflects a deep understanding of security as both a

fundamental right and a prerequisite for development. His administration's actions are not only a consolidation of previous gains but a forward-looking strategy that integrates innovation, community partnership, and resource optimization to ensure Kogi State remains secure, stable, and prepared to confront emerging threats. This strategic focus on security highlights Governor Ododo's commitment to continuity in governance while adapting to evolving challenges, solidifying Kogi's position as a beacon of peace and safety in Nigeria.

In the same vein, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has initiated several reforms in the judiciary, focusing on transparency, accessibility, and efficiency within the judiciary system. This is a positive reflection of optimism for the judiciary's future exemplifying the governor's governance style, particularly his respect for judicial autonomy.

In Strengthening the Judiciary, Governor Usman Ahmed Ododo has emphasized improving judicial infrastructure and supporting the legal system to ensure effective service delivery. This includes appointing experienced legal professionals, such as Barrister Muzi Yinus Abdullahi as the Attorney General and Commissioner for Justice, to spearhead legal reforms and uphold the rule of law.

In a bid to ensure effective delivery of services in the judiciary, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo recently appointed and sworn in 10 new judicial officers in Kogi State with operational vehicles for each of the judges. This includes four High Court judges and one judge for the Customary Court of Appeal. This approach emphasized the critical role of the judiciary in ensuring justice and equity is served fairly and without bias and has been positioned as a reassurance to the public that judiciary being the last hope of a common man is being prioritized and the reforms are seen as addressing capacity gaps and strengthening of the judicial institutions of the State.

To enhance seamless administration of justice in the State, the Office of the Attorney General, held a 3 Day Technical Session between the 6th – 8th of May, 2024 where a four-year strategic plan was developed. This strategic plan created a framework that includes various modalities to help in monitoring and evaluating

the progress of the implementation of the strategic plan of the Ministry of Justice.

Introduction of two (2) Directorates in the Ministry of Justice

On assumption of office, two important directorates were introduced in the Ministry of Justice.

#### These directorates are:

Directorate of Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) was introduced to provide and promote efficient, speedy and cost effective conflict resolution mechanism outside the court room. It aims to reduce case backlogs, improve access to justice and offer quick solutions. It also aims to develop ADR policies, ensure standards and provide specialized trainings for mediators and arbitrators, fostering a culture of peaceful dispute settlement.

Directorate of Gender-Based Violence was introduced to handle Gender Based Violence cases which are prevalence currently in the State. So far, the directorate has collected and analyzed GBV data, formulated policies and promote public awareness through newspapers publications, radios, community outreach, sensitization and prioritizing survivor's support in line with international obligations on gender justice.

His Excellency, the Executive Governor of the State has assented to not less than 13 Executive Bills passed by the Kogi State House of Assembly. These laws includes the following


- **Criminal Cases:** 249. some have been completed while some are currently pending in various High Courts of Justice in the State
- Civil Cases: 112 civil cases spread throughout the High Courts in the State, Federal High Courts and Industrial Courts. It is important to state that not less than 42 of these civil cases are labour related which are currently ongoing before the National Industrial Court, both in Lokoja and Abuja

# GOVERNOR ODODO'S STRATEGIC RESPONSE TO HERDERS/FARMERS CLASHES, INCESSANT KILLINGS IN KOGI COMMUNITIES

erders and farmers' clashes, coupled with the tragic loss of innocent lives, have become a deeply entrenched issue in parts of Omala and Dekina Local Government Areas of Kogi State. This recurring crisis has persisted for decades, defying the efforts of successive administrations to find lasting solutions. The situation reached a particularly devastating peak in 2014 when the peaceful Bagana community in Omala Local Government awoke to a horrifying attack by suspected herders. This assault left behind a trail of destruction, including the loss of numerous lives, homes, and livestock, with the community plunged into grief and despair.

Despite the best intentions, previous administrations struggled to implement effective measures to address the crisis. Mediation efforts and conventional conflict resolution strategies were employed but failed to yield significant results, primarily because they lacked robust mechanisms for shielding the community from the constant threat of overnight attacks by aggressors.

The crisis escalated further in 2017, with the Ojuwo-Ajoma'igbi community in Dekina Local Government Area falling victim to an overnight invasion by unknown assailants. This assault resulted in the deaths of no fewer than 17 people, leaving countless others homeless as the invaders burned down houses indiscriminately. Determined to address the situation, then-Governor Yahaya Bello demonstrated exceptional courage by personally visiting the devastated area, crossing multiple rivers and streams to reach the locus of the tragedy. Bello declared a resolute war on the criminals, deploying security personnel to the affected areas and neighboring communities. However, while this intervention brought temporary relief, it was with limitation, as attacks resumed whenever security personnel were redeployed elsewhere.

### The Lingering Challenge of Insecurity

The inability to establish a permanent security presence in these areas, due to insufficient personnel and financial constraints, left the communities vulnerable to repeated attacks. The absence of a Forward Operation Base (FOB) or a similar facility further exacerbated the problem, as it hindered the security agencies' capacity to provide a rapid and effective response to emergencies.

Elected on the platform of "Continuity and Consolidation," Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has risen to the challenge, taking decisive steps to address the longstanding security issues that occasionally threatened the peace of the state. Building on the security framework left by his predecessor, Yahaya Bello, Ododo has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of all Kogites.

Governor Ododo's Renewed Commitment to Security
Governor Ododo has made his administration's stance on security
clear: he is determined not only to combat criminality but to defeat it
decisively. During the commissioning of a Quick Response Unit (QRU)
of the Nigeria Police Force sometime in June 2024, he unequivocally
stated his commitment to proactive governance: "As your governor, I
was not elected to pay condolences to victims of kidnappings or violent
crimes. I am not here to try, or to make an attempt. I am here to defeat
criminality."

This statement encapsulates the governor's determination to prioritize the security of lives and property above all else, signaling a consolidation on a more strategic and proactive approach.

### Strengthening Kogi's Security Framework

Within the first few months of his administration, Governor Ododo has demonstrated his dedication to creating a robust and responsive security framework across the state. His actions include the procurement of over 250 operational vehicles and hundreds of motorcycles for various security agencies, ensuring enhanced mobility and efficiency in addressing security challenges. By equipping security personnel with these resources, Ododo has significantly enhanced their ability to conduct effective surveillance and respond swiftly to threats. Additionally, over 2,000 local hunters have been recruited and equipped with essential gear, including ballistic vests, combat boots, and modern security gadgets. This initiative not only empowers local communities to take an active role in their own security but also serves as a valuable complement to the efforts of conventional security forces.

Establishment of Forward Operation Base in Omala Perhaps the most impactful of Governor Ododo's interventions is the establishment of a Forward Operation Base (FOB) in Abejukolo, alongside a Joint Taskforce Patrol Base in Bagana. These facilities are designed to serve as strategic outposts for security operations, addressing the persistent threat of bilingual attacks on Omala communities.

The FOB is expected to play a transformative role in bolstering security in the region. Its strategic location will enable security forces to respond more rapidly to emergencies, reducing reaction times and minimizing the potential for loss of life and property. By providing a visible and reassuring military presence, the FOB will not only deter potential aggressors but also restore confidence among local residents, fostering a sense of stability and security.

The Joint Taskforce Patrol Base in Bagana will provide additional support to the FOB, ensuring a sustained security presence in the area. Together, these facilities which are supported with critical logistics such as gunboats and patrol boats to secure waterways, motorcycles to facilitate access to remote and rugged terrains, and vehicles for comprehensive operational support will bolster security operations. This initiative represents a significant step toward breaking the cycle of violence and insecurity that has plagued the region for so long.

### A Holistic Approach to Security

Governor Ododo has emphasized the importance of collaboration in addressing security challenges. By fostering closer coordination between the military, law enforcement agencies, and local vigilantes, his administration is creating a comprehensive and unified approach to security management. This holistic strategy not only enhances the effectiveness of individual security measures but also ensures a more sustainable and long-term resolution to the crisis.

### Promoting Peace and Development

The establishment of the FOB and related security interventions underscore Governor Ododo's belief that a secure environment is essential for socio-economic growth. By prioritizing the safety of lives and property, the administration is laying the foundation for investments, infrastructure projects, and improved living conditions for residents.














# Chapter 11: Ministry for Local Government and Chieftancy Affairs

Today, Bagana is experiencing a new dawn of peace and development.

This landmark achievement has positioned the ministry as a responsive institution capable of navigating complex communal issues with tact and empathy, reinforcing the belief that lasting peace is possible when political will meets decisive action.

The conduct of the 2024 local government elections in Kogi State is widely regarded as one of the most transparent and credible in recent history. Held under the current administration, the elections were devoid of the usual controversies, violence, and post-election litigations that have marred similar exercises in the past.

Following the successful inauguration of the elected local government officials, the councils have begun to function with renewed vigour and clarity of purpose, further affirming Governor Ododo's commitment to participatory democracy and credible leadership at the grassroots. In today's Kogi State, traditional rulers are no longer seen solely as custodians of history and culture. They have been fully integrated into the state's security architecture. Through strategic collaborations, the Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs ensures that traditional rulers now play active roles in intelligence gathering, conflict mediation, community policing, and social harmony.

This innovative approach has not only increased the efficiency of grassroots security management but also bridged the gap between the government and the governed. Communities now have more trust in their leaders, knowing that their voices can be heard and their concerns addressed.

## SUPPORTING COMMUNITY INITIATIVES AND GRASSROOTS PARTICIPATION

Commending the project's successful completion, the Governor remarked, "This Unity Hall is a testament to our collective urge and

desire to build an efficient and all-inclusive governance which tends to unite the 21 Local Government Areas of the State, irrespective of tribal, political or religious sentiments." The Governor also urged commission staff to maintain the facility with pride. Chairman of the Commission, Hon. Adams Adabenege, praised the administration's focus on infrastructure and committed continued staff support. The initiative forms part of broader efforts to reform and professionalize local government service delivery in Kogi State.










































































#### States with the Best Year-on-Year IGR Growth Rate (2022-2023)









#### 10 STATES WITH THE LOWEST IGR, 2023








#### NOW STATES MET THEM 2023 BUDGET 2023 State's Revenue as a percentage of 2023 Budget

# Chapter 13: Ministry of Transportation

THE vision of the Ministry of Transport, Kogi State is to create a modern, integrated, and sustainable transportation system that enhances mobility, supports economic growth, improves the quality of life, and connects all communities within Kogi State and beyond.

Its mission includes to plan, develop, and maintain efficient, safe, and environmentally-friendly transport infrastructure across all modes—road, rail, water, and air, through innovative policies, strategic partnerships, and community-driven initiatives that contribute to the social and economic advancement of Kogi State.



#### Sustainable Transport Infrastructure: Ododo's Audacious Airport Initiative and Broader Achievements

Strategic investment in transportation infrastructure remains a cornerstone for economic competitiveness and social cohesion. Kogi State, centrally located and bordered by ten other states including the Federal Capital Territory, serves as a vital gateway between Northern and Southern Nigeria. The importance of a robust transport system in Kogi cannot be overstated, and under the leadership of His Excellency, Alhaji Ahmed Usman Ododo, the Ministry of Transportation has advanced several transformative projects that reaffirm the state's commitment to infrastructure-led development.

#### **Legacy Projects and Foundations**

Building on the foundation laid by former Governor Yahaya Bello, the current administration has inherited and enhanced a range of transport projects. Under Bello, the upgrade of the Lokoja Mega Terminal and the construction of vital roads like the Itakpe-Ogaminana-Okene road, Ibana-Ikeje-Emonyokwu-Ogugu road, and Ejule-Umomi-Ugwolawo-Amaka-Idah road helped to unify rural and urban communities while accelerating the flow of goods and services.

## Key Achievements under Governor Ododo

## 1. Introduction of Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) Initiative

In response to the removal of fuel subsidies and its impact on transportation costs, the Ministry, under Hon. Atuluku Victor Levi, has embraced the Federal Government's initiative to promote CNG-powered vehicles. Kogi State was among the first to launch the conversion incentive program and distribute CNG buses to transport operators in Lokoja. This move has resulted in a remarkable 40% reduction in transportation costs and reflects a dual commitment to economic relief and environmental responsibility.

## 2. Public-Private Partnerships and Strategic Engagements

The Ministry has engaged Autogas Service Nigeria Limited and other stakeholders to broaden the impact of the CNG conversion initiative. These partnerships are focused not only on easing the cost of transport but also on fostering a cleaner, more sustainable transportation ecosystem through reduced carbon emissions.

## 3. Zariagi International Airport Initiative: A Bold Leap

Perhaps the most groundbreaking

initiative under Governor Ododo is the plan to revitalize and upgrade the Zariagi International Airport. With a license secured from the Federal Government, this project stands as a testament to visionary leadership aimed at unlocking Kogi State's economic potential.

#### **Key Benefits of the Airport Project:**

- i. Economic Growth: Enhanced access to trade routes, markets, and investment opportunities.
- ii. Improved Connectivity: Facilitates the movement between urban centers and remote communities.
- iii. Tourism Boost: Increases accessibility to Kogi's rich cultural and historical landmarks.
- iv. Job Creation: Provides employment opportunities across construction and aviation services.
- v. Emergency Response Hub: Allows rapid deployment of aid during crises.
- vi. Environmental Efficiency: Designed with modern standards that reduce emissions and improve air travel sustainability.

## 4. Development of Water Transport Infrastructure

Flanked by the Rivers Niger and Benue, Kogi is uniquely positioned to benefit from inland water transportation. In a step toward leveraging this natural advantage, the Ministry received four fibreglass boats from the National Hydroelectric Power Producing Area Development Commission (N-HYPPADEC) to enhance ferry services and inter-state commerce via waterways

#### 5. Establishment of a Federal Transport Terminal

In collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Transportation, the State Government is set to construct a state-of-the-art Federal Transport Terminal along the Lokoja-Okene Expressway. Governor Ododo has approved four hectares of land for this project, which will serve as a vital hub for passenger and cargo movement, further positioning Kogi as a transportation powerhouse in Nigeria.

#### **Challenges and Forward Outlook**

While the progress is commendable, the Ministry remains aware of the challenges that come with large-scale infrastructure projects—ranging from land acquisition and environmental concerns to capital costs and equitable access. However, with strategic planning, sustainable practices, and inclusive stakeholder engagement, the Ministry of Transportation is poised to turn these challenges into opportunities for growth.

Finally, the Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's administration is rewriting the narrative of transportation in Kogi State through innovation, vision, and bold leadership. From adopting cleaner fuel alternatives and enhancing road networks to establishing an international airport and modern terminals, the Ministry of Transportation is setting a new standard for sustainable development and connectivity. These achievements are not just infrastructural—they are transformative pathways for economic inclusion, social integration, and lasting prosperity for the people of Kogi State.

## Policy Brief

#### Strategic Transport Sector Milestones Achieved by the Kogi State Government in 2024

This policy brief outlines key developments in the transport sector under the administration of His Excellency, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, through the Ministry of Transport. Each milestone is analyzed through the lens of strategic governance goals including economic diversification, energy transition, infrastructure modernization, and social inclusion.

#### 1. Conversion Incentive Program (CIP)

Launched on October 3, 2024, in collaboration with the Federal Government and Mono Energy (PICNG consultant), this program enables the free conversion of 10,000 commercial vehicles in Kogi State to Compressed Natural Gas (CNG). Targeted at transport workers under NURTW, NARTO, and RTEAN, the CIP promotes green transport and reduces dependence on fossil fuels

Strategic Objective Achieved: Transition to clean energy, enhancement of transport sector efficiency, and alignment with national climate goals.

#### 2. Approval of Zariagi International Airport

On October 9, 2024, the Federal Government approved the construction of Zariagi

International Airport. The project is currently in the design phase and covers Landside, Terminal Building, and Airside infrastructure.

Strategic Objective Achieved: Boosting regional connectivity, promoting tourism, trade and investment, and elevating Kogi's strategic relevance in national aviation logistics.

#### 3. Institutional Engagement with PICNG

The Honourable Commissioner's visit to the Program Director of PICNG on September 10, 2024, facilitated commitments to install CNG stations statewide. This strengthened federal–state collaboration in sustainable energy.

Strategic Objective Achieved: Institutional synergy for energy security and long-term cost reduction in transportation.

#### 4. Inland Water Transport Enhancement

On October 9, 2024, Kogi State received four fiberglass boats from N-HYPPADEC to improve water transport. Commissioning is scheduled for June 2025, with lifejackets from the Federal Ministry of Marine and Blue Economy expected to arrive by June 5, 2025.

Strategic Objective Achieved: Expanding multi-modal transport options, improving rural access and safety standards.

#### 5. Federal Transport Terminal Development

A 4-hectare site has been approved along the Lokoja– Okene Expressway for a federal transport terminal. This is a joint project with the Federal Ministry of Transportation and serves as a hub for intercity mobility

Strategic Objective Achieved: Integration into national logistics framework and support for regional economic hubs

#### 6. Revival of Ashok Leyland Buses

The Ministry began restoration of four dormant buses from the Wada administration. One has been completed, and three others are over 50% refurbished for deployment along major Lokoja corridors.

Strategic Objective Achieved: Resource optimization, public transport revitalization, and revenue generation via KGIRS.



# Chapter 14: Youth, Women and Special Needs

Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo's first year in office has been defined by a remarkable dedication to empowering the youth, advancing women's inclusion, and supporting persons living with disabilities (PLWDs).

his administration has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to addressing unemployment, fostering inclusivity, and driving sustainable socioeconomic development across Kogi State. By adopting a multi-dimensional approach, the administration has rolled out innovative programs aimed at equipping citizens with the tools needed to thrive in a rapidly changing world, ensuring that no one is left behind.

A flagship initiative in the administration's youth empowerment drive is the Ododo Youth Empowerment and Skill Acquisition (OYESA) program. Designed to tackle unemployment and build a skilled workforce, the program targets 250 youths from all 21 local government areas of the state. The training, hosted at the Nigeria-Korea Friendship Institute, offers participants the opportunity to gain proficiency in modern vocational skills. Fields of training include automotive technology, plumbing, solar power installation, welding and fabrication, electrical repairs, computer hardware maintenance, and networking. These areas were carefully selected to align with emerging industry demands and provide beneficiaries with skills that are both relevant and marketable. Participants receive comprehensive support during the program, including monthly stipends and accommodation, ensuring that financial and logistical barriers do not impede their success. Upon completing the training, participants benefit from additional support such as the registration of business names with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC), the provision of starter kits, and certificates of proficiency. These measures position trainees not only to secure employment but also to establish their businesses and contribute meaningfully to economic diversification. The OYESA program is complemented by other impactful initiatives, including the Youth Transformation Programme of the Niger Hydroelectric Power Producing Areas Development Commission (N-HYPPADEC).

Through this program, 705 beneficiaries across 10 communities in Kogi State have received vocational training in diverse fields such as computer applications, fashion design, poultry farming, catering, fish farming, shoe and bag making, graphic design, and more. The program's inclusivity ensures that participants from local government areas like Ajaokuta, Adavi, Bassa, Ibaji, and Lokoja benefit equitably. Additionally, N-HYPPADEC distributed starter kits to all trainees, including

solar energy installations, ICT gadgets, sewing machines, and catering equipment, enabling them to immediately commence operations in their chosen fields. This initiative reflects the administration's commitment to creating sustainable livelihoods and reducing dependency on white-collar jobs. The meticulous selection process employed by N-HYPPADEC further underscores its dedication to ensuring fairness and transparency, with the beneficiaries drawn from marginalized and underserved communities.

Governor Ododo's vision for Kogi State extends beyond youth empowerment, as his administration has placed a high premium on women's inclusion in governance and economic activities. On the aspect of Women affairs and Social Development Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has facilitated the following;

- Built the capacity of about 70 staffs on both internal and external training programs
- A two-day capacity-building workshop for the children's parliament demonstrating his commitment to empowering young leaders
- The training of WRAPA FIELD Officers in collaboration with the Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Development aimed at training volunteers for effective management of Gender Matters and gender mainstreaming at the State level to empowering women and promoting social economic development of the women folk
- 3 days capacity training on the implementation, monitoring and reporting of the third action plan on women peace and security. This is a comprehensive approach to develop a deeper understanding of the objectives, strategies, and indicators, required for successful implementation of the National action Plan of the Peace and Security of Women and technically equip our officers with the requisite knowledge at domesticating the State Action Plan accordingly.
- The Ministry under also organized a one-day training and capacity building workshop for Police Gender Desks officers in the Divisional Police Station in the state to facilitate the effective management of Gender Based violence in the state thereby promoting a healthy socio-economic development of the state
- The ministry has setup a gender equality and women empowerment platform to coordinate all interventions on gender issues and galvanize greater gain for gender management in the state
- The Ministry also demonstrated its commitment to caring for the elderly through its collaboration with the provision of care and medical support to the elderly to enhance their wellbeing and reduced the degree of vulnerability in the State

# Governor Ododo's Impressive Female Line-up Proves Gender Sensitivity

Rabiatu Okute, the Commissioner for Humanitarian Affairs, to champion empowerment for women - from top to hottom

Hajia Mariam Abedo, Dirctor-General of the State Pension Commission has overseen payment of billions in backlog pension payments while Barr. Ladi Ahmed Jatto is leading Kogi's award-winning environmental sustainability, climate change and community resilience efforts, first at NEWMAP and now at ACReSAL. Aisha Omade, head of Kogi State Social Investment Programme Agency (KOSSIPA) is in the forefront of social welfare for vulnerable groups.

In elective positions women also hold approximately five out of eleven key positions per Local Government Area, including 1 female Local Government Chairperson (first in the history of the Confluence State), 20 female vice chairpersons and council leaders and over 80 elected female councillors. Under Ododo women leadership has moved beyond tokenism.

Ododo's Kogi is, without doubt, working for women.

# Office of the First Lady

#### . TAKES INVESTMENT DRIVE TO CANADA

PRINCE ALBERT, CANADA - NOVEMBER 2024 - Kogi State made a strong case for foreign investment and international partnerships at the 3rd International Conference on Raw Materials (ICERMS) held from November 2-8, 2024, in Saskatchewan, Canada.

The state was represented by a three-member delegation led by Dr. (Mrs.) Folashade Arike Ayoade, Secretary to the State Government. Others were Hon. Mohammed Bashir Abubakar, Commissioner for Solid Minerals and Natural Resources and Hon. Barr. Moses Okezie-Okafor, Director-General, Research and Development.

At the conference, Dr. Ayoade delivered a goodwill message on behalf of Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, in which the Governor affirmed Kogi State's commitment to sustainable resource management, economic diversification and ease of doing business. Hon. Abubakar's presentation branded Kogi as 'The

Solid Minerals Capital of Nigeria', while Hon. Okezie-Okafor spotlighted reforms driving the state's rising appeal to serious investors.

The delegation held strategic meetings with international stakeholders and was hosted by the Mayor of Prince Albert, Hon. Greg Dionne in his offices at City Hall. The Mayor received a Kogi State Medal as keepsake and expressed interest in bilateral partnerships. Discussions explored collaboration in mining, agriculture and education. A visit to a diversified Canadian farm offered practical insights into integrating tourism and agribusiness to boost rural incomes in Kogi

Like Kogi State, Saskatchewan has abundant natural resources, and is known for innovative technologies, world-renowned agricultural products, a strong workforce, good market access and competitive incentives. Unlike Kogi State, the Canadian province has substantially exploited these endowments. Saskatchewan supplies more than a third of the world's total exported durum wheat and is the world's top exporter of lentils and dry peas. It holds the world's largest reserves of potash and high-grade uranium, and is a significant producer of other critical minerals like lithium, helium and rare earth elements.

Key outcomes include interest from Canadian investors in Kogi's solid minerals sector, prospects for agricultural innovation, and opportunities for skills development partnerships.

The Conference which had support of the Office of the Prime Minister of Canada and that of the Premier of Saskatchewan bolstered Kogi's international visibility and opened pathways for partnerships that could significantly enhance the state's transformation agenda under

## Chapter 19:

## Civil Service and Pensions Administration

overnor Ahmed Usman Ododo's first year in office has been considered by exceptional strides in labor relations and worker welfare, exemplified by the successful implementation of the New National Minimum Wage in Kogi State. His administration's prompt actions to domesticate the federally approved N70,000 minimum wage and its enhancements underscore his commitment to improving the livelihood of civil servants and pensioners in the state. This report reflects on the systematic, inclusive, and effective processes employed by the administration to achieve this milestone and its broader implications for governance and social welfare.



In July 2024, the Federal Government of Nigeria approved the new national minimum wage of N70,000 for civil servants and private-sector employees, effective immediately. Governor Ododo, renowned for his labor-friendly governance style, promptly directed preparations for implementing this policy in Kogi State, even before organized labor formally applied for its domestication. This proactive approach demonstrated a governance philosophy rooted in empathy and responsiveness, ensuring that workers' welfare remained a priority. By September 4, 2024, the administration had constituted a New Minimum Wage Committee to spearhead the negotiation and implementation process. The committee, inaugurated on September 17, 2024, was composed of government representatives, labor union leaders, and other key stakeholders, ensuring that the interests of all parties were fairly represented.

The Head of Service, Pst. Elijah Adeiza Evinemi (FCA), led the committee, with Comrade Gabriel Amari, the Kogi State NLC Chairman, representing the labor unions. The inaugural meeting, held on September 18, 2024, marked the beginning of extensive deliberations on the wage structure. Technical subcommittees examined various proposals, balancing fiscal realities with the need to address workers' financial challenges. Through collaborative and transparent discussions, the committee finalized an agreement on October 19, 2024, setting the minimum wage at N72,500—higher than the federally mandated figure. This decision, reached after consultations with Governor Ododo, reflected his administration's commitment to mitigating the economic pressures faced by workers while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

The terms of the agreement encompassed several progressive measures that reinforced the administration's labor-friendly reputation. The

N72,500 minimum wage was approved for all state and local government workers, with consequential adjustments applied across all grade levels. The implementation also extended to sectoral salary structures, including CONPSS, CONHESS, COMPCASS, CONMESS, CONUASS, CONRAISS, CONTEDISS, and CONTISS, ensuring equitable compensation for professionals across various sectors. Additionally, the agreement introduced a pension harmonization scheme, granting an across-the-board increase of N10,000 for pensioners. This measure sought to bridge disparities and provide financial relief for retired workers, aligning with federal-level increments.

To further alleviate the financial burdens on civil servants, Governor Ododo's administration announced a one-year tax holiday on the salary increment arising from the new minimum wage. This policy, designed to cushion the impact of rising living costs, underscored the administration's sensitivity to the economic realities faced by workers. Furthermore, pensioners receiving less than N50,000 monthly were assured free healthcare services in all government hospitals across Kogi State. This initiative not only addressed critical healthcare needs but also highlighted a holistic approach to

improving the quality of life for retired public servants.

The implementation of the new minimum wage was backdated to October 2024, ensuring immediate benefits for workers and pensioners. This prompt execution positioned Kogi State as a trailblazer in labor policy implementation, earning widespread acclaim. During the National Executive Council (NEC) meeting of the Nigeria Labour Congress (NLC) held in Port Harcourt on November 8, 2024, Kogi State was rated as the best-performing state in implementing the new wage policy. This recognition, based on reports from the state NLC Chairman, affirmed the administration's exemplary labor-management relations and efficient policy execution.

Leadership Lessons from Governor Ododo's Relationship with His Predecessor

I am one of the few Nigerians who has gone through the expense and rigour of professional training and certification by the world-renowned leadership expert, Dr. John C. Maxwell, as a speaker, coach and trainer with his personal mentoring organisation, the John Maxwell Team. Having studied, and still yet understudying, leadership under the No. 1 authority on the subject on planet earth, I count myself qualified to recognize and analyse the laws of leadership as they unfold in real time before us in the uncommon relationship between the last and current Governors of The Confluence State.

Leadership is often defined by the ability to build, guide and inspire. There is no doubt left in the mind of knowledgeable ones that former Governor Yahaya Bello put in place the most extensive suite of achievements of any Governor in Kogi State before him. It might be that one of his role models, former Governor Abubakar Audu, could have done more going by his antecedents in the one term he had, but the Prince of the Niger was denied the time and opportunity by negative forces and happenstance - may his soul continue to rest in peace.

However, despite all he accomplished as the 4th Executive Governor of Kogi State, it has become crystal clear that Bello's greatest accomplishment as a leader was his ability to nurture and hand over power to a successor and allow him to lead without interference, ensuring the continuity and consolidation that is currently powering a sustainable transformation in their State.

'Success without a successor is failure', says a popular truism. This means that success is consolidated and made even more effective when the succession succeeds, especially when it does so as spectacularly as we see in Kogi State between former Governor Yahaya Bello, CON, and his successor, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, FCA. The relationship between these two extraordinary gentlemen is governed, not by ego or conflict but by trust, mutual empowerment and a shared vision for the accelerated development of their beloved Kogi State.

Their relationship provides us the materials for a living case study of the above principle against the background of intractable crises which are erupting in real time between other notable predecessors and successors in the nation. Truth be told, their relationship is actually an anomaly in the Nigerian political space where conflict between predecessors and successors have not only become a recurring decimal, but an existential threat to our very democracy itself.

### Yahaya Bello - The Secure Leader Who Built for Continuity

'Only secure leaders give power to others.' This is the foundation of The Law of Empowerment, the 12th of John Maxwell's 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership. For many Nigerian leaders, succession is a tool for indirect rule - a means to retain power by proxy over the territory they have allegedly 'handed over' - by micromanagement, interference and even outright sabotage of their successor.

Yahaya Bello has done the exact opposite. He did not just nurture and pick a successor - he mentored, empowered and prepared him for leadership ahead of time. More importantly, once the transition was complete, he stepped back and let His Excellency, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo lead. Inasmuch as constitutional term limits circumscribe a Governor's stay in Office, a leader who raises a successor and actually allows him to lead without interference is a leader who understands legacy over control and values vision over vanity.

In the cutthroat world of Nigerian politics, 'the outgoing', as citizens sometimes call them, often evince a pathological need to arrogate to themselves 'godfatherhood' over 'the

incoming' (the godson) which they rub in his face ad nauseam. Leaders like Yahaya Bello who resist the temptation to morph into a puppetmaster after office possess leadership security. It is insecure leaders who struggle with both actual and ostensible transfer of power. They meddle, undermine, resist change and if all else fails, resort to sabotage. His Excellency, Yahaya Bello, CON has, by all accounts, allowed his successor to thrive making sure to hang over his head no Sword of Damocles. In doing so, he activated the 20th law, The Law of Explosive Growth because when you empower a leader, you multiply leadership impact across an entire sociopolitical ecosystem - in this case, Kogi State. Most importantly, he has seen to it that the governance structures he built continue to solidify and serve Kogi well after his departure, thus fulfilling John Maxwell's 21st and final law, The Law of Legacy.

It takes two to tango - and Bello was prescient enough to select as co-traveller in this journey a successor whose integrity and fidelity complements his forthrightness and fearlessness perfectly. As Nigeria now agrees, in the intricate rhythms of leadership succession, one cannot find a better individual than His Excellency, Ahmed Usman Ododo, the 5th Executive Governor of Kogi State and Chief Servant of the Confluence State.

#### Ahmed Usman Ododo - Honoring the Past, Leading the Future

Leadership should be about building bridges, not burning them. It should be about progression, not regression. And most importantly, it should be about governance that serves the people, not the ego of leaders. Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo brings these qualities in abundance to his leadership. In doing so he simultaneously satisfies the demands of several core Maxwellian laws enuciated in the 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership, all of which define great statesmen.

#### The Law of Respect (Strength in Humility)

The Law of Respect is the 7th law of leadership. According to John Maxwell, 'People naturally follow leaders who are stronger, more competent and more principled than themselves'. A leader who acknowledges the contributions of his predecessor rather than seeking to erase them earns the respect of both his team and his people. In the 14 months since Ododo emerged as Bello's successor, he has not wielded office to discredit the past. Instead, he acknowledges and builds upon it, showing that strong leaders do not need to destroy history or existing legacies to build their own.

All of us who started the journey of the New Direction Agenda in Kogi State with Yahaya Bello since 2015 can attest to Ododo's impeccable respect for our boss in the nearly one decade that has passed - both as an aide and now as a Chief Executive. He immediately named him 'The Leader' of the ruling party in the State upon assuming Office - a position Governors hold onto tenaciously. Above all, he has added substance to the title by treating him with nothing but utmost regard and fealty in both words and deeds.

## The Law of Empowerment (Governance Beyond Self)

Like Bello, Ododo also leads by John Maxwell's 12th Law, 'The Law of Empowerment' by default. It says that 'Only secure leaders give power to others, enabling them to grow and lead without fear of losing control'. A leader's strength lies, not just in their ability to make decisions alone, but in how well they empower others. Ododo has been deliberate in making governance a shared responsibility by involving all stakeholders. His leadership is not one of command and control, but of collaboration and inclusion.

I have personally been treated with nothing but the greatest respect by the Governor. Whenever decisions were necessary concerning my office and responsibilities, His Excellency has personally made sure my views were given thoughtful consideration in the final decisions. This is an experience shared by

as many colleagues as I have spoken with both vertically and horizontally - across the leadership value chain in Kogi State.

His Excellency ran on the mantra of continuity and consolidation and has proved ultracommitted to that promise. He speaks often of his resolve to strengthen the political actors and structures entrusted to him by his successor, and has done so with admirable rectitude. His team feel valued and individuals take pride in their contributions. As a result, the people of Kogi State have an administration united in purpose and are reaping a rapid succession of achievements within his one year and 2 months in Office.

## The Law of Legacy (Governance as a Relay, Not a Sprint)

Too many leaders govern with the next election in mind rather than the next generation. Governor Ododo, however, has approached leadership with a long-term perspective, ensuring that his administration builds sustainable structures rather than short-term projects. He honors the work of his predecessor, making it clear that governance is a relay race, not a battlefield.

### The Law of Buy-In (Trust as Governance Capital)

The Law of Buy-In is Maxwell's 14th leadership principle and it clarifies a striking phenomenon about leaders: 'People buy into the leader first before they buy into the vision'. Good governance is not just about policies, outcomes and targets - it's about trust. Since his inauguration Governor Ododo has actively worked to win the buy-in of Kogi's diverse stakeholders - not through empty rhetoric, but through competence, fairness and accountability. He calls himself 'The Chief Servant of Kogi State' and that is what he truly is

In his bid to unite Kogi's diverse peoples, he has taken himself to places and met with persons the average leader would either have nothing to do with or expect to come calling, cap in hand. Today in Kogi State, anyone who imagines

himself at loggerheads with this great man - whether in the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC) or in the opposition - knows in his or her heart of hearts that he or she has proved impervious to reconciliation. John Maxwell insists that people follow leaders they trust - and Ododo has proven himself worthy of trust by all.

## The Law of Explosive Growth (Multiplying Leadership Capacity)

The Law of Explosive Growth posits that leaders who merely want growth, lead followers but those committed to multiplying growth, develop and lead other leaders. Ododo is not merely governing - he is multiplying leaders. By focusing on empowerment rather than control, he is cultivating leadership at every level, ensuring that Kogi's governance structure becomes self-sustaining and generationally relevant. In Kogi State, people of all tribes, religions, genders, age and ability - all demographics - have a place and a say in governance, as leaders and as stakeholders. No wonder the data speak of a burgeoning renaissance across the board.

## The Law of Influence (Leadership Beyond Position)

John Maxwell's most famous quote on leadership is the one about influence. It states, 'Leadership is influence, nothing more, nothing less.' Ododo's leadership is not defined by his title - it is underscored by his impact. His ability to govern without alienating, to lead without dictating and to reform without erasing the past is simply a masterclass in modern leadership.

I hold the view that the reward for transformational leadership in any arena is influence. In that regard, Governor Ododo is reaping a bumper harvest - not just at home but across the length and breadth of Nigeria, and beyond. No wonder Kogites are already united in their increasing clamour for him to get ready for another term at the appropriate time.

## The Kogi Model As a Possible Blueprint for Nigeria

The relationship between Their Excellencies, Yahaya Adoza Bello and Ahmed Usman Ododo is not just a political success story, it is a leadership case study. It is an example of how the continuum of governance should work - one leader builds, another takes over and the vision continues without friction, sabotage or insecurity on either part. I might be wrong (although I don't think so), but I have personally not seen its parallel in the history of Nigerian democracy - at least not in this Fourth Republic.


In a country where political transitions are often marred by vendettas, disruptions, and policy reversals, what I call 'the Kogi Model' offers a pathway to stability and progress. It proves that leadership is about service, not personal gain. It shows that the true greatness of leaders is not just how they lead, but how they step aside for others to lead after them. Nigeria's political elite would do well to study and adopt this model. As Maxwell himself says, 'A leader's lasting value is measured by succession.' Yahaya Bello has left a legacy, not a vacuum. Ahmed Usman

Ododo is carrying that legacy forward - not as a shadow, but as a leader in his own right. That is what true leadership looks like. That is the Kogi Model. And that, ultimately, is part of what Nigeria needs if we are to overcome the predecessor-successor clashes that have become so ubiquitous across our leadership landscape, so often threatening the stability of the polity itself.



#### **KOGI STATE BUDGET 2024**



Budget of Consolidation and Continuity for Inclusive Growth

The Kogi State 2024 budget, approved at N258,278,501,339.00, represents a 30.71% increase over the 2023 revised budget. It includes a significant allocation for capital expenditure (N112.5 billion) and recurrent expenditure (N145.7 billion). The budget prioritizes good governance, infrastructure development, education, healthcare, agriculture, security, and women's empowerment. Kogi State's 2023 and 2024 budgets reveals a strategic intensification of public investment across all sectors, with particularly notable increases in the economic sector (from \(\frac{1}{2}\)68.65bn to \(\frac{1}{2}\)80.5bn) and social services (from \(\frac{1}{2}\)49.36bnto \(\frac{1}{2}\)55.2bn), reflecting the administration's commitment to infrastructure, education, health, and economic diversification. The significant jump in allocations to law and justice (from \(\frac{1}{2}\)5.99bn to \(\frac{1}{2}\)10.1bn) also signals a renewed focus on institutional reform, security and justice delivery. Overall, the shift tells a story of forward-looking governance aimed at consolidating gains, deepening impact, and significantly accelerating the momentum of development across the Confluence State.



Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo has consolidated strongly on the policy of responsible debt consumption instituted by his predecessor. According to the Debt Management Office and syndicated sources, Kogi State's formal debt profile stood at #44.89 billion (domestic) and \$51.17 million (external) as of December 2023, comparing very favourably indeed with its peers. Within one year, the Ododo Administration further reduced these to #41.59 billion and \$31.58 million respectively - achieving a #3.3 billion and \$19.59 million drop during a period of critical economic difficulties triggered by federal reforms to eliminate entrenched fuel subsidies and exchange rate disparities. This was made possible through fiscal discipline, enhanced federal income, improved IGR generation, strategic debt restructuring and transparency. These results, within his first year alone, unequivocally attest that Governor Ododo's governance is delivering measurable progress as underscored by the effectiveness of his strategic debt, and other, policies. His Excellency's Advanced New Direction Administration is firmly setting Kogi State on the highway to sustainable economic growth and financial stability.



## Kogi State's 2025 Budget:

#### **Bold Foundations for Inclusive Development**

When His Excellency, Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo, signed the 2025
Appropriation Bill into law on December 30, 2024, it was not merely an administrative milestone. It was a deliberate declaration of vision and commitment that Governor Ahmed Usman Ododo not only has bold aspirations for his state but the critical intentionality - political will, if you like - to find the resources needed to make them real.

At #582.4 billion, the 2025 budget is the largest in the state's history, marking a 43% increase over the previous year's #406 billion allocation. This expansion reflects an understanding that development requires scale and sustained investment. It also signals that the administration will not be content with incremental improvements but is prepared to initiate and pursue accelerated progress.

Crucially, this is a budget designed for people - a fact that is self-evident from its very metrics. Nearly #211 billion, that is, more than a third of the total sum, is committed to social services such as healthcare, education and social welfare support. These are sectors where the impact of investment is most visible in everyday life, whether it is the child who receives free exam registration, the mother who enjoys free ante-natal and post-natal services, the citizen who finds affordable essential medicines in the community health centre, or the teacher who has a functioning classroom.

At the same time, the budget's capital expenditure - over 52% of total allocations - prioritizes infrastructure that connects communities, powers commerce and unlocks productivity in the state's economy. #228 billion is earmarked for economic and

infrastructure development, a deliberate choice to create jobs, expand food security, secure lives and properties and enhance the enabling environment for enterprise.

Unlike many budgets that become symbolic once signed, this one is anchored in the clear expectations of a public that increasingly demands accountability. From the first day of the budget presentation to its signing into law, Governor Ododo has consistently emphasized continuity - completing inherited projects, addressing local government infrastructure gaps and settling longstanding obligations that have burdened the state's finances, while outlining his plan to unlock strategic development.

Some observers have raised questions about the sustainability of such an ambitious plan, and it is true that translating a 43% budget increase into visible improvements will require discipline in execution and innovation in revenue generation. The administration is fully aware of this reality. Accordingly, the 2025 budget integrates strategies to strengthen tax administration, increase all categories of internally generated revenue, deepen public-private partnerships and streamline project delivery timelines across all Ministries, Departments, and Agencies.

Equally important is the commitment to transparency. The Governor has directed that all MDAs must publish implementation status reports, creating clear lines of accountability and opening the door for citizen engagement in monitoring. This is a critical safeguard against the historical challenges of underperformance and unspent allocations - as well as the perennial demons of waste and leakages.


Perhaps the most defining feature of this budget is its spirit. It is framed by a belief that governance must be inclusive - a long time objective of the New Direction Agenda. This is driven by a passion to see that development reaches even the most rural communities as surely as it serves the urban centres. From local road rehabilitation to health infrastructure and school improvement, every component of this budget is designed to reflect the priorities of Kogi's diverse people.



In this sense, the #582 billion appropriation is more than a financial plan. 
